## Circle Time

December's Circle Time stories come from *Wee Believe – God's Word for God's People: We Belong to God*, published by PC(USA). This curriculum builds foundations to help young children learn about God's love for them which helps prepare them for Church School.

- 12/3 – *An Angel Visits Mary* – Luke 1:26-38
- 12/10 – *An Angel Visits Joseph* – Matthew 1:18-25
- 12/17 – *Jesus Is Born in Bethlehem* – Luke 2:1-20
- 12/24 – *Jesus Is Born and the World Rejoices* – Luke 2:1-20
- 12/31 – *Mary and Joseph and Simeon and Anna Are Thankful for Jesus* – Luke 2:21-40

The stories this month tell the story of the birth of the Christ child, beginning with Mary finding out she is to have a baby. Next, Joseph learns Mary is going to have a baby. After waiting for some time in which they prepare for his birth, Jesus is born. And then the family and friends of Mary and Joseph learn of his birth and they rejoice and give thanks! At its center, this is the joyful story of the birth of a beloved child and a child of God. When we are baptized, we too are called children of God. What better time to talk with your children about their baptism into this church and into this community. What better time to tell them the stories associated with their arrivals into your families as your beloved children. Pull out those baby and toddler pictures! Pull out their birth or adoption announcements! Pull out the little socks and shoes and tiny clothes. Rejoice and give thanks for your little ones – and then rejoice and give thanks for God's gift to us – his son, Jesus Christ.



Check Out the Check-In Window Book. *It's an easy way to promote early literacy and provides a way to talk with your child about aspects of faith.*

*The First Night*, by B. G. Hennessy and paintings by Steve Johnson with Lou Fancher, tells us of the first few hours of Jesus's life and captures those first tender moments when a family welcomes a new child into their midst. Simply beautiful.

## The Parenting Journey...

*The Parenting Journey* is intended to give you something to consider and perhaps incorporate into your personal parenting journey. It is inspired by the book *Becoming the Parent You Want to Be* by Davis and Keyser.

The seasons of Advent and Christmas are often rich with family rituals and traditions. Bill Doherty, author of *"The Intentional Family: Simple Rituals to Strengthen Family Ties"* and professor of Family Social Science at the U of M, defines a ritual as something which is repeated, coordinated and significant. Traditions or rituals, at their best, illustrate the importance of family, can create a family identity, build security and a sense of belonging, and may provide a time for generations to be together.

As you celebrate the seasons of Advent and Christmas with your family, consider the following questions:

- *If you had to pick the nicest tradition your family had while you were growing up, what would it be?*
- *What are the traditions you are creating or establishing for your children as they grow up?*

Davis and Keyser tell a story in their chapter titled "Working Toward a Balance of Needs" called "Memories happen now." They go on to say: *This is the only childhood our children ever have. The way we live now, the things we do as a family are the ground from which our children's awareness and expectations are being shaped. Periodically refocusing on what we truly value, and reminding ourselves that family life is not a race to the finish line, can inspire us to make the most of each moment.*

So, as we celebrate the seasons of Advent and Christmas, what memories will you be making with your children? Slow down and consider how to make the most of this time with your little ones and enjoy the blessings of the season.
